

Success Stories WIA Adult

<u>Oil region</u> -O.R. completed its first 2 Trade OJT contracts in over two years. One of these Trade OJT clients ,Peter P., was originally laid off from Joy Global. Peter accepted an OJT training position at Franklin Insurance Agency as an Insurance Agent. This is the first OJT Franklin Insurance Agency has participated in. This client will be responsible for learning and comprehending different types of insurance such as; automobile, fire, life, property, marine, malpractice, etc. Another Joy Global client, Timothy W., obtained an OJT with Specialty Fabrication and Powder Coating (SFPC) as a Cost Estimator, earning \$14.65/hr. This too was the first time this employer utilized the OJT program. Joshua S., Adult eligible client, was placed on an OJT contract. This client started his OJT as a welder at Oakland Products, at \$11.00/hr. VTDC was able to purchase his welding mask through their Supportive Services.

<u>Crawford</u> - Staff provided an OJT for Brian C., an Adult eligible client, at Excellent Tool. His training was complete this April. The client received a \$1.00 raise per hour upon successful completion which brings his hourly rate to \$17.00.

<u>Clarion</u>- Three dislocated Workers were placed into employment during April. Adam C., David G., and Kevin M, each received an ITA at PA Pride ,and are now working as Truck Drivers. One Adult client, Robert B., is finishing his OJT at PennKraft in April. He is being exited into full time employment as their Purchasing Agent, earning \$14.42/hr.

- <u>Warren</u>- Staff provided a Dislocated worker with an ITA for their CDL License. He recently accepted employment as a Truck Driver earning \$12.00. Warren Staff are monitoring ENC (Ellwood National Crankshaft) assessments for job seekers provided in the Warren CareerLink.
- <u>Erie-</u> Erie Staff have been providing a Job Club where accepted clients commit to meeting once a week for eight weeks. In April, two of these Job Club clients entered full time employment. One of these clients, Corey B., was laid off from GE. He obtained employment at Sterling Dula as an Engineer. Sterling Dula is offering full benefits including a 401K and Life Insurance. He will also be receiving the rate of pay he requested. Warner Trucking Company hired another Adult client, Tammy C., during April. They offered her a full time truck driver position at \$16.00 per hour, with full benefits and a 401K along with a signing bonus.
