

Funding Streams

1. Title I formula funding

- a. Adult Funding (\$1,609,339 for PY18/19)
 - Eligibility determined Primarily by income level
 - Eligibility can also be established by presence of a “significant barrier” to employment (e.g. ESL, ex-offender, absence of HS diploma)
 - Up to 20% of our Title I, Adult dollars can be used on incumbent worker training, based on income eligibility for each worker
- b. Dislocated Worker (\$1,459,640 for PY18/19)
 - Eligibility determined by unemployment status
- c. Youth (\$1,787,505)
 - Eligibility based on income or a series of qualifying conditions (e.g. receipt of public assistance, past or current dependency status, etc.)
 - 75% of funding must be spent on Out-Of-School Youth
- d. TANF Youth
 - Eligibility based on income for youth under 18 years of age

2. EARN (approx. \$1,420,000 + possible \$772,000 performance payments)

3. Rapid Response funding (approx. \$181,000 for current program year)

- Targeted to dislocated workers of a specific employer/industry dealing with significant layoffs

4. State Apprenticeship Expansion Grant (up to \$30,000)

- Grant aims to increase number of apprentices, inform the public about the merits of apprenticeship, and expanding apprenticeship opportunities into non-traditional industries and occupations.

5. Economic Transition (\$450,000)

- Cover 100% of training costs and comprehensive supporting services of participating dislocated workers (projected: 15)

6. State/Local Internship Program (\$83,122)

- Subsidize wages of about 40 interns for 8 weeks in the summer.

7. Teacher in the Workplace 1+2 (\$99,960 + \$33,273)

- Educators are provided experiences interacting directly with industry and business leaders, and learning about industry trends, needs, and opportunities that they can bring back to the classroom to enhance instruction, student learning, and career readiness

8. Business Education Partnership (\$157,160)

- Educate students, parents, and guardians about high priority occupations and career pathways

9. NextGen Industry Partnership – Advanced Diversified Manufacturing, Convening (\$43,252)

- State’s new IP model – a partnership of businesses in advanced diversified manufacturing that work with economic development, education, workforce development, and other community partners to improve the coordination of programs

10. NextGen Industry Partnership – Building and Construction, Convening (\$36,984)

- State’s new IP model – a partnership of businesses in building and construction that work with economic development, education, workforce development, and other community partners to improve the coordination of programs

11. PAsmart Pre-Apprenticeship (\$60,000)

- System and program development for registered pre-apprenticeship and registered apprenticeship programs in PA
